The following report summarises the participant feedback from the CPHC Conference held on Monday 7<sup>th</sup> & Tuesday 8<sup>th</sup> April 2014


**HEADLINE FINDINGS**




- ❖ Respondents were most satisfied with the conference keynote speaker (3.50) and the new heads workshop (3.33)
- ❖ Respondents were least satisfied with the social media presentation (2.24)
- ❖ In terms of the administration, delegates were most satisfied with the parking facilities (3.46), the on-line registration (3.44) and the dinner (3.44).

**Q1 – How satisfied or dissatisfied were you with each of the following aspects of the CPHC Conference?**












**Additional comments:**

**Q2 – How satisfied or dissatisfied were you with the Conference, AGM and Reports?**









**Additional Comments:**

#### Q5 – If you have any further comments about how the conference could be different or improved please comment:

- Maybe a session on important new trends in computing education that we need to be aware of.
- More BCS input
- Nothing against panels as such, but they need to be much more focused.
- Perhaps it would make sense to have separate discussions about issues that emerge in the three tiers of UK HE, namely large research-intensive universities (~Russell Group), research-oriented smaller universities (~pre 92 smaller universities), and teaching focused universities (~post 92 universities). While this implies a division, it also recognizes the existing differences between these three groups of universities. Ignoring these differences can often make discussions sterile, as the common ground of issues across these three groups of universities may be very limited, or alternatively the discussion can become dominated by the interests of the largest group, i.e. the teaching focused universities. The separate discussions could be held serially such that everybody can take part in all of them, but the discussions would be led by the participants from the relevant group of universities.
- The “new heads” workshop could be more interactive – it is mostly just presentation from the front.

- The venue of catering lunch and tea was a bit congested and did not help talk to people more freely....more space please next time.
  - This was my first CPHC conference and was broadly what I expected.
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**Technical notes on research method:**

- This survey was conducted on-line by BCS among delegates of the CPHC Conference.
- A total of 18 responses were received during the period 25<sup>th</sup> April to 12<sup>th</sup> May 2014, a response rate of 38%.
- Where responses do not sum to 100% for single response questions, this is normally because the 'no replies' to individual questions are included in the calculations, but not displayed.
- Where these are obvious, spelling mistakes and grammatical errors to verbatim comments have been corrected.
