- Whilst recognising the “impressive support and commitments from partners” HEFCE decided not to progress the proposal.

Promoting Careers in Computing Education

- CPHC members value opportunities that bring academics from different institutions together to share their experiences and of the LDG activities is to run “sharing practice” workshops on various themes within the discipline.

Promoting Careers in Computing Education

- In response to the recommendation in the Royal Society Report After the reboot: computing education in UK schools that 'higher education providers need to promote careers in computing education to a wide range of students'. LDG (with Oxford Brookes University and the University of Kent) ran a two-day workshop (27/28 March 2018).
- A key output from the workshop will be a CPHC Sharing Practice Report which will include case studies from participants, narratives from students, and reflection on issues raised.



CEP conference

- LDG supported the second Computing Education Practice conference (11/12 January 2018).
- At that conference, the formation of a UK chapter of the ACM Special Interest Group on Computing Education (SIGCSE) was proposed.
- Work on this has proceeded, and the chapter has been constituted. LDG look forward to working closely with UKICSE in the coming year.
